The above plan is a delineation of one of the most valuable cotton plantations on the sea coast of Georgia, situated in Chatham County, on Ossabaw Island. I consider it secret to none. The soil is also well adapted to the culture of corn, sugar cane, rice, cotton, peaches, pears &c. This plantation is not only desirable for its superiority of soil, but for the healthiness of atmosphere, the convenience of fishing and hunting, and the opportunity of transportation. Mr. Alexander M. Gould is the proprietor of these lands, and long may he live to enjoy pleasure and prosperity, but mindful of that eternal home.
