Ossabaw Island is a 26,000-acre undeveloped barrier island on the Atlantic Ocean, owned by the State of Georgia. Georgia's first Heritage Preserve, accessible only by boat, is set aside for natural, scientific and cultural study, research and education; and for environmental preservation, conservation and management of the island's ecosystem.

The Ossabaw Island Foundation is a non-profit 501 (c)3. Through a partnership with the State of Georgia, TOIF inspires, promotes, and manages exceptional educational, cultural, and scientific programs that are designed to maximize the experience of Ossabaw Island, while minimizing the impact on the island's resources.

TOIF hosted an unprecedented number of volunteers in preparation for the rehab of the Torrey West House and Little Torrey House. Five temperature-controlled shipping containers plus other island sites now hold the furnishings of both buildings, moved and stored by volunteers over a five-month period.

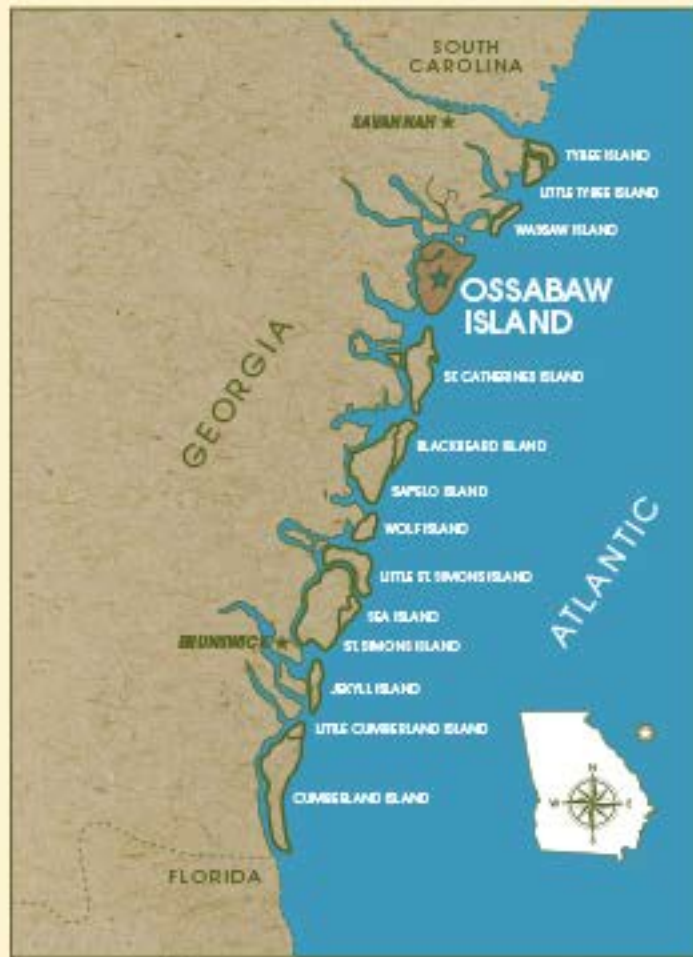
